Strip and Finish Procedures

FLOOR CARE MAINTENANCE

EQUIPMENT NEEDED

Assemble Supplies and Prepare Floor

Proper stripping requires the right equipment. Some or all of it may be necessary for complete and efficient removal of finish.

Remove any soil and chewing gum with scraper and thoroughly dust mop.


STRIP

• Place wet floor signs.

- Wet Floor Signs
- Clean Mop
- Clean Bucket
 - Swing Machine
- Black or Hi-Pro Swing Machine Pads
- Vacuum (to remove stripping solution)
- Burnisher (optional but recommended)
- UHS Pads for Burnisher (optional but recommended)
- Xlerate[™]
- Blue Concentrate SC
- G2 Green Finish



FINISH APPLY FINISH



To apply finish, mop finish down using the "box and eight" technique. Finish is ready for a new coat when it passes

BIG PRO TIP: The Paper Test

- 1. Wait until finish has dried for period of time listed on package directions.
- 2. Place a piece of loose paper directly on floor surface.
- 3. Use your hand or the sole of your shoe to gently rotate the paper back and forth. If the paper rotates easily (without "ticking") the floor is dry.

$\mathbf 2$ ADDITIONAL COATS



Apply up to 4 coats of G2 Green Finish in 24 hours. Applying more than 4 coats increases the likelihood of a slow cure.

Apply a minimum base of 5 to 6 coats of finish for optimal results.

Note: If the floor is

still slippery when the stripper is applied, there is still finish on the floor.

FORCE CURE



PRO TIP: When last coat of finish has dried and passes the "paper test," buff the floor using a burnisher fitted with an UHS pad to "force cure" the floor and maximize the gloss.
